Best Practice Guidelines

325 When performing a surgical skin prep for necrotizing fasciitis: if skin is intact perform as usual, however treat intact skin carefully due to loss of structure under the skin; or if skin is broken consider the open area to be contaminated and prep the open area with a separate sponge after prepping the surrounding area

skin Head-to-toe skin assessment Patient is admitted or readmitted DO BOTH Complete head-to-toe SKIN and PU RISK assessment on admission Do both more frequently if significant INSPECT AND PALPATE change occurs or per facility protocol Document all skin issues, including: Skin color Skin temperature Skin turgor Skin moisture status Skin

Principles and practice of high-dose rate penile brachytherapy: Planning and delivery techniques of the contralateral side may be avoided to allow skin or mucosal sparing on the uninvolved side After each needle placement, an interstitial catheter is guided over the needle

A skin cleanser with a pH range similar to normal skin is preferred over traditional soap This should be labelled as being indicated or suitable for use in the management of incontinence Structured skin care regimens that incorporate gentle cleansing and the use of skin protectants have been shown to reduce the incidence of IAD
